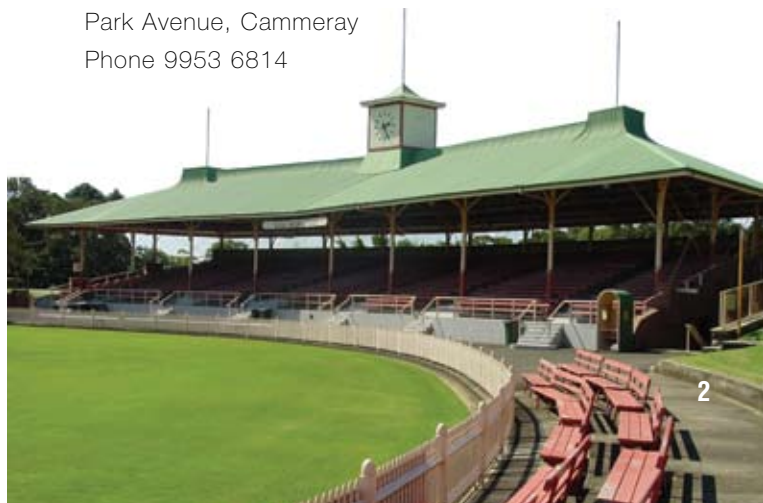

Sportsgrounds

Anderson Park

Clark Rd, Neutral Bay

Football field, two cricket fields, cricket nets, change rooms, seating, public toilets and timed lights.



Cammeray Park

Between Ernest St, Park Ave and Cammeray Rd

Nine-hole golf course, football field, four tennis courts, croquet lawns, change rooms with showers and toilets, canteen, spectator seating, timed lights and skate park.

Forsyth Park

Montpellier St, Neutral Bay

Two hockey/football fields, two cricket fields, long jump pit, change rooms with showers and toilets, seats, bush pathway, scout hall, community centre and timed lights.

North Sydney Oval

Cnr Miller St and Ridge St, North Sydney

The No 1 Oval has been used as a cricket and football ground since the turn of the century and

is considered one of Sydney's finest ovals with many original features. No 2 Oval is close by in St Leonards Park.

Primrose Park

Grafton St (entrance off Young St) Cremorne

Four tennis courts, two football fields, hockey field, four cricket fields and nets, change rooms, car park, public toilets, tennis club, art and craft centre, bush pathway, seating and timed lights.

St Leonards Park

Cnr Falcon St and Miller St, North Sydney

Playground equipment, bowling green, North Sydney Oval (No 1 and No 2), two netball courts, basketball hoop, North Sydney Leagues Bowling Club, cricket nets, shelters, seating, public toilets, spectator seating.

Tunks Park

Off Brothers Ave, Cammeray

Playground, car park, five cricket fields, two mini soccer fields, three football fields, change rooms, public toilets, canteen, shelter sheds, bush pathway.



Waverton Park

Woolcott St, Waverton

Football field, cricket field, change rooms, public toilets, playground, seats and tables, Waverton Bowling Club and timed lights.

Indoor Sports Centre

The North Sydney Indoor Sports Centre is located at 36 Hume Street between the Pacific Highway and Willoughby Road, on top of the Hume Street car parking station. Basketball and badminton is mainly played at the Centre.

The Centre consists of four fully enclosed playing areas, grandstand seating, meeting and change rooms, office space, and parking for up to 100 cars. The Centre is also able to accommodate disability sports, such as wheelchair basketball. Open 9am – 11pm weekdays, 8am – 6pm weekends.

Bushwalks

The North Sydney Harbour Foreshore Bushwalk Guide contains practical information on the length of walks and transport access, as well as information about the Aboriginal and European history of the area and the types of flora and fauna you might expect to see. Please note that dogs must be kept on a lead when in bushland.

Bushcare

Bushcare is a volunteer program operated by North Sydney Council. Participants meet regularly to regenerate bushland areas. Swimming and Fitness

The North Sydney Olympic Pool, fitness and leisure centre comprises a 50-metre heated pool, gymnasium, sauna, spa, indoor 25-metre pool and cafe. The Pool complex gives customers the opportunity to combine swimming with other leisure pursuits in the one spectacular location overlooking Sydney Harbour, next door to Luna Park and the Sydney Harbour Bridge. North Sydney Sport and Recreation Reference Group
