Various	Street Play Program	In Spring 2020 Council will hold a pilot 'Street Play' program. Participating Streets will be temporarily closed to traffic so they can be 'opened for people', providing space for kids to play and the community to enjoy. Council will provide some basic street furniture and games for each day to help create an atmosphere of a 'park in the street'. The days will also provide an opportunity to use Council's new parklet. 'Play' days will be held in the following locations: Laycock Street. 8 November 1-5pm McHatton Street (North Sydney Demonstration School). 13 November 12-2pm Rosalind Street/Edwin Street, Cammeray. 15 November 1-5pm Burlington Street, Crows Nest. 22 November 2-6pm Colin Street, Cammeray. 6 December 1-5pm These streets were chosen based on community nominations. Streets as Shared Spaces Funding grant Council successfully applied for \$1,000,000 in grant funding under the Streets as Shared Spaces program to implement trial or 'popup' pedestrianisation and placemaking projects.

The grant will be allocated towards projects in Miller Street, North Sydney, and Burton Street and Bligh Street, Kirribilli.

Tempora ry Plaza Young Street will be closed to vehicular traffic from 2 November 2020 to March 2021 to allow for the temporary closure and implementation of a new pedestrian plaza. The plaza will respond to community demand for increased open space in Neutral Bay and strengthen walking links to the Neutral Bay Village and public transport.





Various New Parklet

A proportion of the funds provided by the NSW State Government under the Streets as Shared Spaces program have contributed to the purchase of a new 'parklet'. The parklet will be used initially to use as part of the Street Play program, following which it can be used in locations across the LGA to provide place activation and contribute to more walkable streets.

Community members are welcome to nominate a location for the parklet.


New pedestrian crossings

Construction was completed early in 2020 on new pedestrian crossings and associated landscaping and footpath improvements at the intersection between Albany Street and Oxley Street, St Leonards.

The works significantly improve pedestrian accessibility between St Leonards and Crows Nest and provide a direct walking link to the forthcoming Metro Station. Council successfully applied to the RMS for a \$110,000 grant to part fund the works.










Cycling participation under Social Distancing

Usage of the Ernest Street cycle path continues to grow significantly. The below graphs provide an overview of monthly usage and trends in overall usage. Notably, numbers jumped rapidly since the implementation of social distance requirements despite a significant drop in commuter travel, indicating that far more local residents and community members are now choosing to cycle around the LGA.





New bike parking rails

Council regularly installs new and upgraded bike parking rails and O-rings (attached to sign stems/poles) as part of streetscape upgrades projects in the North Sydney CBD and village centres.

In 2020, 21 new rails and 13 hoops have been installed throughout Neutral Bay and Cremorne, with 3 further to be installed soon.
