HOW DOES THIS AFFECT YOU?

For the safety of event participants, extensive road closures and special event clearways will be in place in your area for the Sydney WorldPride March on Sunday, 5 March 2023.

The March will see 50,000 people travel from North Sydney across the Sydney Harbour Bridge, onto the Cahill Expressway, Macquarie Street and finishing at the Domain & Hyde Park, The March will begin at 7am, with the last participants crossing the bridge at 10am.

Please familiarize yourself with the road closure map overleaf and plan your movements ahead of time. If you need to access your vehicle on event day, ensure it's parked outside of the closures. It's a fineable offence to drive on or exit a driveway onto a closed road.

ROAD GLOSURES

Key roads in North Sydney will be closed including the Sydney Harbour Bridge.

- From 2am to 12.30pm: sections of Pacific Hwy at North Sydney near Harbour Bridge on-ramp will close.
- From 4am to 11:30am: Sydney Harbour Bridge including the Cahill Expressway Circular Overpass will be closed. In North Sydney, sections of Walker St, Blue St, Arthur St, Hill St and Pacific Hwy will close.

Managed residential access will be in place for sections of Mount St and Walker St. Follow directions of traffic controllers. The Harbour Bridge walkway and cycleway will remain open. The Cahill Exp Walkway will be closed from 6am to 11am. Roads in the city will also be closed between 4am and midday

DETOURS

The Sydney Harbour Tunnel will remain open, and motorists can access the Tunnel via the Neutral Bay Falcon St or Military Rd onramps. Heavy traffic is expected so motorists are urgent to delay non-essential travel until after midday. Drivers can also consider using the Victoria Rd detour route. There will be no access between the Cahill Expressway and Macquarie St until after 12pm. Motorists travelling eastbound on the Cahill Expressway Circular Quay Overpass will be diverted via the Domain Tunnel.



SPECIAL EVENT CLEARWAYS

Special event clearway parking restrictions will be in place on roads near you between 1am and 11.30am.

Clearways are strict no-parking zones and

apply even to local residents or TfNSW

Mobility Scheme Permit holders. These clearways are in place to clear the area of vehicles for the event. Check the yellow signage carefully when parking on the day, and the night before as vehicles left in signposted clearways will be towed and a fee applies. If your vehicle is towed, call the Traffic Information Line on 132 701.

Organizers work closely with NSW Police, Transport for NSW, and other Government Stakeholders to deliver the 2023 Sydney WorldPride March while minimizing impacts on residents, businesses, and road users.

You may experience slightly more noise than usual, resulting from event related activities including early morning broadcast helicopters, entertainment, and general event activities. Event organizers will make best endeavors to ensure this is kept to a minimum.
