b) In response to a discussion/question that arose at the previous meeting, AL provided information to Precinct regarding a DA application by Wenona (i.e., minor internal adaptation, but inside a heritage item), of works approved by CDC that to repurpose the old pool area and comments regarding the existing public use of school facilities including the Independent Theatre and the Learn to Swim school.

3 - Correspondence

a) Precinct e-news

a) Ridge St bridge – temporary arrangements. Precinct discussed the current interim ramp is inefficient and unacceptable, and the extent of construction noise is unacceptable.

Precinct considered Option 2 (i.e., ramp with lift) is the superior option by a strong margin.

b) Bradfield Park

Precinct discussed the recent events and felt that Council should have resisted more strongly on behalf of the community, that matters should not be rushed through without proper consultation and the absence of proper information did not permit residents to determine an informed position.
