Sydney Harbour Bridge closure for special event – Sunday 25 June 2023

Road impacts

The **Sydney Harbour Bridge** including the Cahill Expressway Circular Quay Overpass will be **closed** in both directions from **4am to 10:30am on Sunday 25 June 2023** for the FIFA Women's World Cup 2023™ Sydney Harbour Bridge Unity Celebration. Burton St at Milsons Point will close from 4am to 11.30am.

The Sydney Harbour Bridge cycleway and footpath will remain open.

Detours:

While the Harbour Bridge is closed motorists will be diverted via the Sydney Harbour Tunnel, delays are expected so allow extra time or avoid travel until after 10:30am.

Citybound traffic from the Anzac Bridge will be detoured via Bathurst St off-ramp and all traffic accessing the Western Distributor from Fig St and Pyrmont St will be detoured via the King St off-ramp.

Buses will also be terminating either side of the bridge in the city and North Sydney from 4am to 10.30am. Trains continue to operate across the bridge during the event.

Parking changes

Special event clearway parking restrictions will be in effect from 3am to 10:30am on roads in Milsons Point and North Sydney and from 6am to 10:30am in the Sydney CBD to accommodate traffic on detour routes.

Check signs carefully before parking. Clearways are **strict no-parking zones** for all vehicle types including those with local and businesses parking permits or



TfNSW Mobility Scheme permit holders. If your vehicle is towed call 132 701 to speak to an operator to find its new location.

What to expect

To celebrate 25 days to go until the official kick-off of the world's largest women's sporting event, FIFA Women's World Cup 2023™, the Sydney Harbour Bridge will be closed for a colourful celebration involving the grassroots football community, multicultural communities, local and international football legends on the Sydney Harbour Bridge. The event is free to the public however registrations for tickets are required.

The event will be staged between the pylons on the bridge starting from 7:30am. There will be additional infrastructure including portable toilets, marquees, generators, lighting towers and fencing in Bradfield Park North. Residents are advised there will be some noise from crowds, PA and staging systems during the event however organisers will ensure this is kept to a minimum.

The closure of the Sydney Harbour Bridge to support this event involved extensive consultation and approvals from multiple NSW Government authorities and agencies.
