#### **PURPOSE:**

The purpose of this report is to provide an update on Sustainable Transport Projects at North Sydney Council.

#### **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

This report contains an update on current Traffic and Transport Operations projects related to sustainable transport. The projects include:

- Young and Grosvenor Street Intersection
- West Street Cycling, Walking and Streetscape Upgrades, Stage 1.
- West Street Cycling, Walking and Streetscape Upgrades, Stage 2.
- Route 3 Active Transport pedestrian/cycleway program.
- Get NSW Active Grants.
- Bike Facilities
- Bike repair and maintenance courses
- Increasing Pedestrian Capacity at Neutral Bay B-Line Stop
- Transport for NSW Active Transport Network Review.

## Background

This report provides an update on current sustainable transport projects completed since the last reference group meeting.

#### Report

Project	Detail
Young and Grosvenor Street Intersection	<ul> <li>Proposed design for the Young and Grosvenor Street Intersection were publicly exhibited from Tuesday 4 July to Monday 14 August. Council undertook a range of consultation activities, including: <ul> <li>5 X pop-ups</li> <li>1 X webinar</li> <li>1 X walkthrough</li> </ul> </li> <li>The proposed design will be taken to traffic committee for technical advice. If endorsed the proposal will be submitted to a Council Meeting for approval.</li> </ul>
West Street Stage 1	West Street Stage 1 was officially opened in July. The upgrades have delivered 100 metres of cycleway of Priority Route 1 Sydney Harbour Bridge to Cammeray, additional trees, public domain upgrades, pedestrian/cyclist crossing, foot path widening and additional garden plantings.
West Street Stage 2	The final concept designs are nearing completion and consultation is planned for late 2023.
Route 3 – Kirribilli to Mosman	Previously exhibited designs are currently under review to consider community concerns.
Get NSW Active Grants	<ul> <li>Council has been successful in securing two grants from the Get NSW Active program. These include:</li> <li>\$135,000 to refresh of the North Sydney Integrated Cycling Strategy 2014</li> <li>\$73,700 for the construction of a continuous footpath treatment at the intersection of Park Avenue and Military Road.</li> </ul>
Bike Facilities	<ul> <li>Additional bike facilities have been installed at the following locations:</li> <li>Corner of Merlin Street and Falcon Street</li> <li>Bike pump at the Sydney Harbour Bridge steps</li> <li>Bike pump at the Ridge Street and West Street intersection</li> </ul>

Network Review	
	Council staff prepared a submission to the Warringah Freeway Upgrade, Active Transport Network Review (attachment A) public exhibition. The submission made several short-, medium- and long- term walking and cycling upgrades that could be implemented to minimise the negative impact the Warringah Freeway Upgrade has had on active transport.

  - Wherever at all possible, the phasing out of button-activated pedestrian crossing phasing in North Sydney in favour of systematic pedestrian crossing phasing, as currently exists in Sydney CBD.
  - Any provision in the Warringah Freeway Upgrade for cyclist access to the freeway south of the Amherst St Cammeray exit.
  - Any details of gradient-manageable cyclist access to Neutral Bay via the Ridge St overpass.
  - Any plans on the Pacific Highway north of the Middlemiss St underpass for a cycle lane to North Sydney.
- 2. Tony Stanley would like to discuss the following:
  - Updated NSW Speed Zoning Standard and how the new 30km/h classification will be applied in North Sydney.
  - Pacific Hwy shared path impact from WFU works.
  - Oversized SUVs in North Sydney.
- 3. Carolyn New would like to discuss the following:
  - Access routes to metro stations

With the opening of metro envisaged in 2024, with large bike parking compounds at Crows Nest and Victoria Square Stations, what consideration (by Council together with or without Metro) has been given to access routes to those compounds (and their promotion) beyond the short access from immediate adjacent streets. A radius of at least 2km needs to considered (preferably 5km) and that will require working with adjacent councils.
