GENERAL BUSINESS

Chair reported that on 28 November 2023 the State Government announced its intention to introduce new planning rules via a State Environmental Planning Policy (overriding Council Policies) in order to fast track low and mid-rise housing.

It intends to permit:

- terraces, townhouses and two-storey apartment blocks in R2 Low Density Residential zones within 800m of transport hubs and town centres (currently only permitted in 6% of low- density residential zones across Sydney)
- 3-6 storey apartment blocks in R3 Medium Density Residential Zones within 800m of transport hubs and town centres

The objective is to increase housing density within a 10 minute walk of transport hubs (stations, metro stations, bus interchanges) and shopping precincts (potentially Cremorne and Neutral Bay). It will be a major change for a significant proportion of Sydney's local government areas and indicates the State Government will give housing supply a very high priority at the expense of its relations with local government. The proposal is about to go on exhibition over the Christmas period. The proposal has some echoes of the Part 3A approval processes of the last Labour Government that left office in 2011.

MOTION: That Precinct writes to the Mayor and:

- thank her for the Mayoral Minute at the Council Meeting of 27/11/23 concerning correspondence from the Minister for Planning regarding housing density and the housing crisis;
- express Precinct's concern about the impact that the State Government's Proposal to fast track low and mid-rise housing in the R2 Low Density and the R3 Medium Density Residential Zones in Cremorne given:
 - a) there is no station or metro station and Military Road and bus services are already under strain and;
 - b) the lack of planning to provide the infrastructure needed to support the additional density such as open space, sports facilities and schools.

3) ask her to express these concerns to the Minister for Planning.
