1. Acknowledgement of Country

SM (Parks) opened the meeting by acknowledging the traditional owners of the land on which the meeting was held and welcoming all attendees to the meeting.

2. Guest Speaker – Councillor Zoe Baker, Mayor of North Sydney – NSW Government Housing Reform

Presentation Focus: NSW Government Housing Reform

ZB (NSC) spoke to the NSW Government's proposed Housing Reforms and how they will impact on the North Sydney LGA.

- Announced in November by The Hon. Paul Scully Minister for Planning and Public Space
- Discussed two parts impact North Sydney
 - Part 1 Transport orientated Development: prioritizing development around Transport Hubs
 - Part 2 Low to mid rise Housing reform

ZB (NSC) also spoke to the North Sydney Olympic Pool (NSOP) providing an update on the project.

- At the first Council meeting on 12th February 2024 Mayoral Minute talked about the history of the project and how we got here, but particularly about the failure of external guardrails.
- Want to strengthen the organisation to make sure there is no future council that would walk to a poor set of decision-making. 8 to 2 voted to do a Government and Decision-making framework.
- IPART doing a review of financial model for council's in NSW
- OLG have put in new Audit and Risk Management guidelines that have to be implemented by all Councils by July 2024.
- Wrote to OLG last term of Council raising concerns that the Audit, Risk and Improvement
 Committee which had external members met 16 times during the peak period and didn't once raise
 an issue.
- Confidential report that came to Council with extensive legal advice
- Public resolution that the Council has resolved to increase the budget by an additional 20 million to delegate to the General Manager to obtain a loan for that amount to
- Budget from \$85 million to \$105 million.
- Getting a proper accounting of the real budget, the original budget didn't include a whole lot of
 things that are now included; like the cost of insurance, project management, fit-out, eastern
 stairwell, maintenance to aqua dining place etc. The new figure is terrible but is now an accurate
 and transparent account.
- Resolved: delegated to the General Manager to enter into a deed of settlement and amended contract with ICON to address proposed financial arrangements under the contract.
 - Effectively deal with variations and costs under contract that stretches back to March 2021 and will now be resolved by the deed of settlement
- Issue with the structural steel over the 25m pool. Identified in September when ICON put it up and it buckled. Architect and builder working with the Council to resolve that. Separate issue as to who is responsible, but it is not the Council.
- None of the structural steel could be reused so it needed to be re-ordered which is part of the cause of the most recent delay

Questions asked of guest speaker -

On proposed Housing Reforms:

- Are they offering to have a better process for populations with greater needs?
 - No funds being made available for things like schools or open space in LGA
- Are petitions worthwhile pursuing for the Housing Reforms?
 - Would need to move at Council Meeting but time is of the essence (submissions close Friday 23 February)
- Does the Council have pricing for impact? What is the increased density proposed compared to current zoning?
 - No numbers have been released
 - o Would be great to see what Greater Sydney Studies have done.
- What are we doing about the livability (entertainment etc.) of Council?
 - A series of strategies to guide the next 10 years will be developed this year
 - Guest speakers will be sought to discuss this topic in the next meeting

On NSOP update:

- Is there an ongoing cost to the Council's budget?
 - o Of course there is. There are no changes to service levels this financial year
 - o Robust conversations around financial implications
- Is the right external advice being followed?
 - As confident as can be about internal and external expertise
 - All of the things that didn't happen up front are in place now

On other issues:

- Why West St Cycleway is going ahead when the full implications of the changed traffic flows from the Warringah Freeway Upgrade and everything else is happening is unknown.
 - O Taken as a comment to take back to the organisation
 - The reason is it is under the Bike Strategy and the Councils way of capturing NSW active and sustainable transport funding is to have things that are ready to go which means they need to have been community consulted
- Neutral Bay Junction of Young St & Grosvenor intersection changes which is going to be torn to
 pieces during the construction period of nearby development with trucks not getting around it and
 questioning how much usage it will get
 - About the timing of Council's works and construction
 - o Taken as a comment to take back to the organisation
