Acknowledgement of Country

LS: (Brightmore) – Q: How are you going with the Honor Board (for schools who provide voluntary rates) A: The Mayor's office is handling that, I don't think there have been any responses.

MB (Milson) – Q: Can the council legally change the structure of the levies that were originally put in place? A: We're essentially taking away the levies and putting up the rates to include the same revenue, but the legal framework is up to IPART to determine.

CB (Neutral) - Q: Who were the consultants on this project?

A: Morrison Low conducted the independent report that to go with the special rate variation.

CB (Neutral) - Q: How can you justify a 51% increase in rates for the 75% of residential properties that are units, terraces, and cities when they are likely the poorest part of the community?

A: It is not my assessment, the independent report by Morrison Low has made their assessment based on the figures. If you have concerns, you can submit them to IPART.

JB (Anzac Park) – Q: Was there much consultation regarding the new projects and rate increases? A: Many of these projects have previously been consulted on but left on the shelf as they were not budgeted. That's what IPART will be looking at. There is a chance that IPART don't provide for X, Y or Z but we think that they are all important.

MB (Milson) – Q: What are the assumptions in the council's financial modelling and the program to pay down debt?

A: The council aims to maintain a stable financial position while addressing immediate needs and long-term priorities through a combination of revenue generation, asset management, and strategic borrowing.

LT (Willoughby Bay) – Q: Is the pool what killed Council

A: The message from projects like the NSOP project to Local Government is that we are not big project builders. Moving forward we will get external project managers for large scale projects (eg. Hume Street Park)

MB (Milson) – Q: Rebuilding Council's reserves is essential, but looking at some of these new projects I am worried Council will make the same mistakes as with the pool.

A: We need designs and plans for projects to be 'shovel ready'. If we don't have 'shovel ready' projects we will miss out on grant money to fund such projects.

JB (Bay) - Q: What is the basis of the evaluation of property/assets based on? perceived rather than existing assets?

A: The value for commercial property is based on what we can sell them for in the current market.

RS (Lavender Bay) – Q: Who decides the priorities of the projects?

A: The Councillors. Council provides information to all Councillors for them to make a decision. All Councillors can put forward a Notice of Motion to alter plans and priorities set out by the Council. They are also aware that if they want to add something, something else needs to be taken out

JS (Lavender Bay) – Q: What are the rules and regulations around borrowing from NSW Treasury and the low interest loans they offer?

A: Those are called TCorp loans, and they are actually competitive with what the banks are offering and not as low interest as has been mentioned. It would also depend on the project we would be taking the loan out for (eg. Affordable Housing).

JB (Anzac Park) – Q: Why is Council paying for the fit out of the gelato bar and the gym?

A: We will be operating the gym, that is why we are fitting it out. There was no interest in the market to fit out the Gelato Bar so we will fit it out and then go back to the market to find an operator.

JB (Anzac Park) – Q: Concerned that the procurement team aren't getting the best value as I know from my working experience that contractors charge a lot more for things when it's for a government entity

A: That is always a challenge and a hard problem to solve. We are looking at things like working on joint contracts at a regional level with other Councils to try overcome this issue.

JB (Anzac Park) – Q: Concerned about the efficiency and productivity of the organisation

A: There are projects underway to address this from process mapping across Council. Currently we have 250 processes mapped of 2,000 to help improve processes. We are potentially teaming up with Strathfield Council to undertake a review on our systems as well as shared internal audits with NSROC partners and service reviews

RS (Lavender Bay) – C: On behalf of our Precinct, thank you for the work Council has undertaken on McMahons Point Wharf. We suggest putting a sign telling people not to go down and dig it up as this is already happening.

ACTION: SC NSC to send out the presentation slides.

ACTION: JC (Milson) to send contact details of local resident to SC NSC to address the noise made by a recently installed pollution trap.

ACTION: SC NSC to add suggestion of sign at McMahons Point to the SOA and get response from appropriate team.
