

## Summary of Actions Arising (SOA) Anzac Park 2025

This document is North Sydney Council's response to actions arising from Precinct Committee Minutes. On receipt of the minutes, actions are numbered and allocated to relevant Council Officers for response.

To effectively manage and provide clarity, all actions are allocated a status when reporting to Precinct Committees in response to their minutes. There are three categories:

- **Awaiting Response** - action allotted to Council Officer - response awaited.
- **Open/Ongoing** - action allocated to Council Officer, initial response provided. Matter ongoing and further response/update to be provided at later date.
- **Closed for Council** - Council either completed related works/tasks or has taken all reasonable steps within its power to resolve issue (for example when matter is beyond its jurisdiction). If the Precinct Committee feels Council can take further steps, they can request Council reopen action.
  - a) Sits outside of Council's jurisdiction
  - b) Response given by Council and awaiting Precinct's reply
  - c) Council has completed related works/tasks**Note:** These subcategories are only applied from 2025 onwards)

February	1 (iii)	<b>LYTTON ST CAMMERAY</b> Can Council please provide an update on What is the Timeline for the initiation of works on a Bund in St Leonards Park that was identified by Council as an outstanding Priority Solution.	In November 2024 Council secured a grant from NSW Office of Environment and Heritage. This year Council will commence the process of engaging consultants to conduct the feasibility study and design, which will be followed by an Environmental Assessment and community consultation. It is anticipated that this process will take in the order of 9-12 month to complete. This work is required to inform the Council before a commitment is made to any construction work.	Open/Ongoing

	2 (ii)	<b>ANZAC PARK PRIMARY SCHOOL</b> That the Precinct supports and requests that Council urge TfNSW urgently investigate upgrading the Pedestrian Crossing arrangement at Ernest & Lytton Streets due to Traffic changes with the Freeway Upgrade.	Council has been actively advocating to Transport for NSW (TfNSW) to consider improvements for pedestrian safety. In particular, we have in the past requested that TfNSW explore potential upgrades as part of the Warringah Freeway Upgrade project, or alternatively consider options to improve pedestrian safety via the nearby signalised intersections at Ernest/Miller Streets or the Ernest Street bridge. Adding traffic lights at Lytton/Earnest Street doesn't meet current TfNSW guidelines, due to close proximity to other traffic lights. The most recent correspondence from TfNSW indicates that: "The Warringah Freeway Upgrade project does not include plans to upgrade pedestrian infrastructure at this location (Lytton Street/Ernest Street). Due to space constraints, a pedestrian overpass is not feasible, and there are no plans for a signalised pedestrian crossing. " Council is still in communication with TfNSW and there are draft plans to reallocate a greater portion of roadway space into a pedestrian pathway from Ernest Street bridge to facilitate walking and also include other forms of pedestrianisation options being planned in the area. This is a dangerous situation with the prevailing traffic of the Warringah Freeway Project' Construction Trucks	<p>Traffic have responded that Transport for NSW through its contractor CPBDTi JV never used the traffic control as a pedestrian enhancement it was to mitigate Heavy Vehicles using the Cammeray Avenue Entrance to WFU as main line access is now granted and that section of works has been completed there is no need for traffic controllers.</p> <p>Traffic Controllers would not be supported for full time use at this intersection as it would create further confusion over normal traffic operations in nearby streets and have the unintended consequences of slowing Ernest Street.</p>	Closed for Council - a
