# 5.2. West Street, North Sydney - Parking Restriction Change

# PURPOSE:

The purpose of this report is to seek the committee's endorsement to change unrestricted parking to time restricted parking with permit holders excepted on West Street between Ridge Street and Myrtle Street in North Sydney.

# **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

- To address community concerns about limited parking availability and low turnover of spaces along West Street, Council undertook community consultation to convert unrestricted parking to "2P 8:30am-6pm Mon-Fri Permit Holders Excepted Area 21" between Ridge Street and Myrtle Street.
- The proposal aims to make short term parking more accessible by increasing turnover and to support a vibrant urban environment, in line with Council's Community Strategic Plan.
- On 10 February 2025, Council adopted its Integrated Transport Strategy which includes a Strategic Direction to ensure a fair allocation of assets, parking and road space to promote sustainable travel and prioritise access for those who need it most. The proposal would align with this strategic direction by improving parking availability during business hours allowing residents and visitors will have greater opportunity to park in the area.
- Occupancy surveys undertaken for the parking indicate between 95% and 100% of spaces are occupied during both daytime and evening hours indicating that drivers would be currently highly unlikely to find an available parking space to park at any time. This supports community concerns that the high occupancy and limited turnover severely limit access to the parking spaces.
- The responses to the consultation show 22% support from the submissions received for the proposal with 78% opposed to the proposal. Reasons for the community's support consisted of improved parking turnover, better access for short-term users, and improved access to local businesses and amenities.

- Objections to the proposal predominantly related to the limited parking availability. These responses included concerns about the loss of long-term parking and concerns about limited parking alternatives for residents who are not eligible for parking permits and do not have access to off-street parking.
- Access to parking is the primary concern outlined in submissions for and against the proposal. The occupancy surveys support the concern that drivers are currently highly unlikely to find an available parking space. Parking demand is also expected to increase with development of the Marist College, new Metro Station and continuation of the West Street cycleway.
- While the consultation received more opposition than support, it is considered that the proposal would help address community concerns about to limited turnover and increase access to parking by ensuring that drivers without a resident parking permit are allowed to park in the area for up to two hours during the day.

# **RECOMMENDATION:**

**1. THAT** the Committee endorse the proposed conversion of unrestricted parking to "2P 8:30am-6pm Mon-Fri, Permit Holders Excepted Area 21" at the following locations:

- Between points 20 metres and 44 metres (4 car spaces) on the western side of West Street, north of Ridge Street, North Sydney.
- Between points 26 metres and 140 metres (19 car spaces) on the eastern side of West Street, north of Ridge Street, North Sydney.

# Background

In response to community concerns about limited turnover and the lack of availability of parking and in unrestricted parking spaces in West Street, North Sydney between Ridge Street and Mrytle Street, Council undertook occupancy surveys on 16 July 2024. The surveys showed that at least 95% of the kerbside parking was occupied during the daytime and evening.

Subsequent surveys undertaken on 28 February 2025 and 1 April 2025 recorded a parking occupancy of 100% during the daytime and evening. This supports community concerns that the high occupancy and limited turnover severely limit access to the parking spaces.

Between 9 July 2024 and 10 September 2024, Council undertook community consultation on a proposal to convert two sections of unrestricted parking on West Street to "1P 8:30am-6pm Mon-Fri Permit Holders Excepted Area 21". In response to the consultation, Council received 45% support of the change with 65% opposed to the change.

The consultation identified that 1-hour parking was considered a significant constraint on the time people could spend parking in the area and as a result and so, it was identified that a proposed "2P 8:30am-6pm Mon-Fri Permit Holders Excepted Area 21" restriction would better align with community needs based on submissions received.

### Report

Based on the community feedback on the proposal to convert unrestricted parking to 1-hour parking on West Street, North Sydney and to address the limited availability and turnover of parking, a revised proposal for "2P 8:30am-6pm Mon-Fri Permit Holders Excepted Area 21" was consulted between 10 December 2024 and 4 March 2025.

The proposed "2P 8:30am-6pm Mon-Fri Permit Holders Excepted Area 21" restriction would limit any vehicle without a valid parking permit to parking for a maximum of two hours between 8:30am and 6pm Monday to Friday.

The parking spaces would return to unrestricted controls in the evenings and weekends. The change would encourage a turnover of vehicles and improve the likelihood of an available parking space while still allowing for drivers to park for longer term in the evening and weekends.

The proposal would align with Councils adopted Integrated Transport Strategy which includes a Strategic Direction to ensure a fair allocation of assets, parking and road space to promote sustainable travel and prioritise access for those who need it most. The proposal would align with this strategic direction by improving parking availability during business hours allowing residents and visitors will have greater opportunity to park in the area.

# **Public Consultation**

Community consultation of the revised proposal, "2P 8:30am-6pm Mon-Fri Permit Holders Excepted Area 21", took place between 10 December 2024 and 4 March 2025. A total of 228 letters were delivered to properties located in the vicinity of the proposal. Further, an online survey was available through Council's "Have Your Say" webpage.

Respondents to community consultation are not considered as votes, but the information is used to assist in determining key concerns, reasons and level of support for a proposal.

In response, a total of twenty-three submissions were received, including five submissions from outside the survey area. Results of the survey are shown in the table below:

The results indicate 22% support from the submissions received for the proposal with 78% opposed to the proposal. Reasons for the community's support consisted of improved parking turnover, better access for short-term users, and improved access to local businesses and amenities.

Objections to the proposal predominantly related to the limited parking availability. This included concerns about the loss of long-term parking and concerns about limited parking alternatives for residents who are not eligible for parking permits and do not have access to off-street parking.

Council investigations into parking controls show that the implementation of timed restrictions in unrestricted parking areas result in greater turnover of parking spaces and as a result, increase the opportunity for drivers to park in the area, particularly in areas where vehicles being parked for long periods of time limit the availability of parking.

Parking availability is a concern outlined in submissions for and against the proposal. The occupancy surveys support the concern that drivers are currently highly unlikely to find an available parking space. Parking demand is also expected to increase with development of the Marist College, new Metro Station and continuation of the West Street cycleway. Given these factors, it is considered that the proposal would help address community concerns about limited turnover and increase access to parking by ensuring that drivers parking for longer term without a permit would be required to turnover to allow other road users an opportunity to park.

# **Submissions Received**

Council consolidates community feedback into major themes as opposed to including every individual submission. Responses to the submissions are also outlined in the table below and considers the amended proposal.

Lack of Unrestricted Parking	<ul> <li>We need areas of unrestricted parking nearby. It should stay unrestricted.</li> <li>There is very little unrestricted parking in the local area, please leave the current spaces as is.</li> </ul>	Parking occupancy surveys have shown that the existing unrestricted spaces are operating near or at full capacity, making it difficult to access an available space. The proposal aims to improve turnover and access for a broader range of users, including residents, visitors, and local business patrons.
Impacts on Residents	<ul> <li>Nearby residents already have off-street parking, which they should use instead of occupying on-street spaces.</li> <li>With the increase in council rates, this is another burden that would cost residents more money in having to rent parking spaces for their vehicles.</li> <li>I don't have off-street parking. We rely on this space when working from home.</li> <li>How can someone working from home spend valuable time moving their car every two hours?</li> </ul>	Council acknowledges the concerns raised by residents without off-street parking. However, it is important to note that on-street parking may be utilised by both residents and visitors. Parking occupancy surveys indicate it is currently difficult to find an available space. The unrestricted parking has resulted in the spaces being occupied for long periods. This limits the opportunity for any driver to park. The proposed changes would improve parking turnover and access to parking. Where a resident has no available off- street parking they may be able to obtain a permit, allowing eligible residents in Area 21 to park for longer durations.
Public Transport	<ul> <li>There is a distinct lack of parking for residents who would like to leave their vehicle at home and utilise public transport.</li> <li>Penalising residents for using the Metro and other means of transport would be counterproductive.</li> </ul>	Council recognises the importance of access to the Metro. However, the aim of the proposal is not to directly increase public transport uptake but to address the limited turnover from long stay vehicles and resulting limited available on-street space.

Previous Consultation	<ul> <li>Leave it as unrestricted as voted before.</li> <li>This is absolutely despicable and shows no regard for what residents have already voted to keep unrestricted.</li> <li>60% of respondents objected to Council's proposal to change from Unrestricted to 1-hour, and now Council is trying to circumvent that outcome by changing it to 2 hours.</li> </ul>	It is acknowledged that the previous proposal to introduce 1-hour parking was not supported by the majority of respondents. In response, the proposal has been revised to a 2-hour limit with permit holder exemptions to better balance the needs of residents, visitors, and local businesses. This revised proposal seeks to address ongoing concerns about low parking turnover, while still allowing eligible residents to park for longer durations.
Businesses	<ul> <li>As our staff start the business from 6am, it is very hard to arrive by public transport. We just need one car park for the shop to make it easy to operate.</li> </ul>	Council recognises the importance of supporting local businesses. However, on-street car spaces cannot be dedicated to specific businesses. Nonetheless, the proposed parking changes aim to improve turnover, which can benefit businesses by increasing access to parking for customers. Commuters who cannot find an available parking space on street can make use of discounted and available parking in Councils nearby parking in Ridge Street and West Street car parks.
Opposition to Parking Meters	<ul> <li>Please do not add any more parking meters around West Street. This is not a commercial area and residents and visitors should not be paying the council to park here.</li> </ul>	The proposal does not include the installation of parking meters.
Support for Proposed Changes	<ul> <li>At the moment, it is impossible to park in this area. Cars are regularly parked by non-residents</li> <li>Unrestricted parking does not free up parking spaces but instead achieves the opposite—cars are left for days, weeks, months, even years.</li> <li>There is a very high demand for short-term parking due to the proximity to the Metro station and to local cafes and businesses. The area adjoins Ridge Street,</li> </ul>	Council acknowledges the high demand for parking in this area and the challenges posed by long-term vehicle storage. The proposed time restrictions would help to discourage vehicle "dumping", improve turnover, and make parking more accessible for short-term users, including those getting dropped off to utilise public transport or accessing businesses.

	which has metered parking, highlighting the precious nature of the resource.	This approach supports better use of limited kerbside space in a high- demand location and help support a more vibrant urban environment, in line with Council's Community Strategic Plan.
Other Concerns	<ul> <li>My main concern is exiting our building (28 West St) via the ramp—visibility is virtually impossible. My proposal would be to have NO parking at all in the two spaces at the top of our ramp to increase our visibility and reduce the risks. Often there may be a van/truck/4x4 parked there making it impossible to see what traffic is coming.</li> <li>Please keep the 1/2 hour parking area in front of No 60-64 West St, North Sydney as it is.</li> </ul>	The two spaces fall outside of the scope of the proposal. Nonetheless, given parking on-street adjacent to driveways is permissible under current legislation, the removal of these spaces is unlikely to be supportable. The 1/2P parking in front of 60-64 West St, North Sydney will remain unchanged.

# Conclusion

Parking availability is a concern outlined in submissions for and against the proposal. The occupancy surveys support the concern that drivers are currently highly unlikely to find an available parking space. Parking demand is also expected to increase with the development of the nearby Marist College, the new Metro Station nearby and the continuation of the West Street cycleway.

Given these factors, while the consultation received more submission in opposition than in support, it is considered that the proposal would help address community concerns about limited turnover and increase access to parking. As such, it is recommended that the Committee endorse the proposed "2P 8:30am-6pm Mon-Fri Permit Holders Excepted Area 21" on West Street between Ridge Street and Mrytle Street.

# Financial/Resource Implications

The cost of upgrading proposed changes to parking restrictions will be covered by Council's Operating Expenditure budget.
