## **Summary of Actions Arising (SOA) Brightmore 2025**

This document is North Sydney Council's response to actions arising from Precinct Committee Minutes. On receipt of the minutes, actions are numbered and allocated to relevant Council Officers for response.

To effectively manage and provide clarity, all actions are allocated a status when reporting to Precinct Committees in response to their minutes. There are three categories:

- Awaiting Response action allotted to Council Officer response awaited.
- Open/Ongoing action allocated to Council Officer, initial response provided. Matter ongoing and further response/update to be provided at later date.
- **Closed for Council** Council either completed related works/tasks or has taken all reasonable steps within its power to resolve issue (for example when matter is beyond its jurisdiction). If the Precinct Committee feels Council can take further steps, they can request Council reopen action.
  - a) Sits outside of Council's jurisdiction
  - b) Response given by Council and awaiting Precinct's reply
  - c) Council has completed related works/tasks

Winnie & Parraween Streets' Intersection - "Keep Clear" Marking Brightmore Precinct requests that Council investigate adding "KEEP CLEAR" road markings in Winnie Street at the entrance to Parraween Street, Cremorne.	NSW Road Rule 128 already prohibits queuing across an intersection. TfNSW Guidelines only support 'KEEP CLEAR' road markings to address a significant safety issue for example obstruction of emergency vehicle egress from a station or hospital, or frequent side on collisions and specifically not for congestion related issues. Of note, there is no exemption to the regulation for stopping in a KEEP CLEAR for drivers waiting for a gap in moving traffic to turn right into Parraween Street, or a left turner exiting Parraween Street and stopping in a KEEP CLEAR after joining a queue on Winne Street. Cat's Eye Reflective Road Markers for Young Street Cycleway between Grosvenor Street and Sutherland Street Request for Council to install reflective markers to make the barriers more visible to motorists.	Reflective markers are not a standard treatment for cycleway kerbs and are contrary to Australian standards and TfNSW Cycleway Design Toolbox. The kerb was painted with reflective white paint during the installation in April 2025.	Closed for Council - b

Young St Cycleway Precinct have requested with such detailed construction designs, could Council explain how this significant underestimation of the loss of parking by so much occurred, especially on the eastern side of Young Street between Grosvenor and Belgrave Streets?	There has been no further reduction in parking beyond the consulted and approved design.  The Brightmore Precinct may have been focused on the Young/Grosvenor intersection project (-2 parking spots), rather than the Young street cycleway (-7 parking spots). One of the key objectives is to "Improve road safety by upgrading infrastructure and implementing programs that foster a culture of safe road behaviours."  While Council is open to advocating for an additional pedestrian crossing to facilitate pedestrians, the introduction of "Left Turn on Red" is not aligned with Council strategy, as it does not support safe or sustainable travel. Given the potential safety risks associated with this traffic movement, Council does not support this proposal. 	8i	Lime Bikes  Does Council track the cost of it dealing with Lime Bikes i.e.  Rangers moving bikes and impoundment? - If so, will it bill the company for reimbursement? - Does Lime have to pay Council for a tender?	Council is monitoring our response to Lime Bike Pty Ltd. We are limited in what action we can take in terms of reimbursement.  However, Council may impound bikes if Lime do not comply with the response times outlined in the Public Spaces (unattended property) Act. Non-compliance can result in fines, impounding and disposal of bikes if Lime does not pay for and retrieve the impounded bikes.  Lime Pty Ltd is currently under no obligation to enter into an agreement with Council to operate. This would need to be legislated under State Government legislation.	Closed for Council
