Summary of Actions Arising (SOA) Milson 2025

This document is North Sydney Council's response to actions arising from Precinct Committee Minutes. On receipt of the minutes, actions are numbered and allocated to relevant Council Officers for response.

The change was proposed after direct discussions with the Kirribilli Hotel in response to concerns about delivery trucks blocking Cresent Place. The No Stopping controls during the morning peak is related to the operation of the traffic signals, required by TfNSW and a pre-existing control. With respect to the concern that the parking change limits visibility for drivers turning right from Broughton Street into Ennis Road, while the parking is located to the north of this intersection, parking on the eastern side of the street has limited impact on the visibility of drivers turning from the northern side of an intersection to the western side of the intersection. Council provided a submission to the Upper House Inquiry into the use of e-mobility devices. This submission (available here), along with over 200 other submissions, has been considered by the Upper House. They released their report on the inquiry in February, which the State Government is required to respond to in the next three months, approximately May 2025. This report is available here . As a member of parliament, Felicity Wilson will be made aware of this report and its recommendations. We encourage the precinct to contact Felicity Wilson directly to inform them of these concerns. Council is limited in what action we can take in terms of reimbursement as this type of action would need to be permitted under State Government legislation. However, we can impound bikes if Lime do not comply with the response times outlined in the Public Spaces (unattended property) Act. Non-compliance can result in fines, impounding and disposal of bikes if Lime does not pay for and retrieve the impounded bikes.
