As Transport for NSW and North Sydney Council are currently in the early planning process, assessing internal needs, processes and capabilities, it is not appropriate at this point to begin this community involvement. When we are ready to commence detailed design and it becomes appropriate to invite a community representative/s, we will determine the ideal format for this so that we make the most effective use of the member/s' time and input.
