## **Summary of Actions Arising (SOA) 2020 - Harrison Precinct**

This document is North Sydney Council's response to actions arising from Precinct Committee Minutes. On receipt of the minutes, actions are numbered and allocated to relevant Council Officers for response.

To effectively manage and provide clarity, all actions are allocated a status when reporting to Precinct Committees in response to their minutes. There are three categories:

- Awaiting Response action allotted to Council Officer response awaited.
- Open/Ongoing action allocated to Council Officer, initial response provided. Matter ongoing and further response/update to be provided at later date.
- Closed for Council Council either completed related works/tasks or has taken all reasonable steps within its power to resolve issue (for example when matter is beyond its jurisdiction). If the Precinct Committee feels Council can take further steps, they can request council reopen action.

		• Location 1 - Rangers Road  Precinct members were favourable towards the proposed design, however, there was concern that if a large vehicle, in particular, a truck, turning into Rangers Road from Military Road stopped to give way to a pedestrian that the vehicle would protrude unsafely into the kerbside lane and this may pose a safety risk to other vehicles on Military Road. 		• Locations 2 and 3 - Holt Ave and Spencer Road Precinct members agreed that option A is preferable, however, questions were raised whether there was possibility of adding pedestrian crossing markings to the proposed design to strengthen pedestrian safety. Precinct members also suggested that bollards need to made more visible especially at night—suggestions include making them a yellow colour or adding LED lighting		
		• Location 4 - Cabramatta Road  Precinct members also questioned the possibility of adding pedestrian crossing markings to strengthen pedestrian safety in this location. Bollards in this location also need to be made more visible. In addition, it was noted that cars, taxis and trucks which drive up Cabramatta Road towards Military Road in the morning looking for a parking place would be unable to turn around given that between 6-10am left turn onto Military Road is prohibited. The proposed narrowing of the left lane would make a U-turn difficult and illegal. Has this issue been considered?		
		• Location 5 - Macpherson Street  While Precinct members agreed that option A is preferable, the possibility of marking the crossings as pedestrian crossings (in the interests of pedestrian safety)		

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		was also raised. In addition, the bollards need to be made more visible so that they can be seen at night. Precinct members are also concerned about possible loss of parking spaces impacting on local businesses at this location (there are several medical practices at this location).  • Parking

		Traffic & Pedestrian Safety Issues: Rangers Road and Spofforth Street intersection - AC provided a summary of past actions and issues at the intersection and efforts to improve pedestrian and vehicular safety. The Precinct Committee understands a group of Spofforth Street residents residing on the Mosman side have been attempting to lobby their council to take action to improve safety but Mosman Council (MC) states it has only one record of a resident complaint about Spofforth Street.  The issues at the intersection were brought before the NSC Traffic Committee of 18 October 2019. Please refer to the Minutes of this meeting for more detailed information.  NSC acknowledges the intersection can benefit from changes and is supportive of resident efforts to pursue the recommendations of the LATM. This includes the installation of two roundabouts - one at the intersection of Spofforth Street and Rangers Road and another at the intersection with Calliope Street. 		<ul> <li>Holt Avenue and Spofforth Street intersection - The intersection of Holt Avenue and Spofforth Street is also unsafe and residents have observed frequent accidents. Residents including Precinct Committee member GH have attempted to contact NSC in the past but was told that Council have no record of accidents at this intersection.</li> <li>It was noted that residents commenced record keeping in early 2019.</li> <li>Issues at this intersection include:</li> <li>Danger from speeding vehicles crossing Spofforth Street at Holt Avenue - particularly to pedestrians.</li> <li>Buses creating visual blockage when parking near corner of Holt Avenue.</li> <li>Obstruction from trucks and other large vehicles which are legally allowed to park outside 122 Holt Avenue in Spofforth Street but which restrict vision to vehicles attempting to turn right and left out of Holt Avenue on the NSC side onto Spofforth Street.</li> </ul>	Council's Manager Traffic and Transport Operations has noted Precinct Committee's comments.  Council's Manager Traffic and Transport Operations has provided the following clarification: Holt Avenue/ Spofforth Street - Design is underway to improve pedestrian safety and operation of the intersection, in consultation with Mosman Council. 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		<ul> <li>Lack of policing - residents report never seeing any speed checks being carried out.</li> <li>Lack of any traffic calming devices on Spofforth Street.</li> <li>B-line - has resulted in increased traffic on Holt Avenue in the morning due to no left turn on Cabramatta Road.</li> <li>The installation of a pedestrian refuge on the NSC side of Holt Avenue was raised as the 'silent cop' is of a little use.</li> <li>Cr Keen stated that NSC has resolved to meet Mosman Council to restart discussions regarding Holt Avenue and Spofforth Street and that communication on this matter remains open.</li> <li>Cr Keen also stated that she has asked NCS to look at all pedestrian crossings and is sure Spofforth Street will be included.</li> <li>Action: NSC to clarify</li> </ul>

	Some ideas for improving general safety of Spofforth		
	Street included the installation of another raised		
	pedestrian crossing on Spofforth Street - between		
	Cabramatta and Spencer or Spencer and Holt Avenue and		
	the installation of traffic calming devices.		
	The meeting was advised that the new practice is to		
	install raised crossings immediately adjoining a		
	roundabout - such as those installed by MC at the		
	intersection of Military, Middle Head and Bradley Head		
	Roads.		
	A comment was made (by GS) that roads must be made		
	safer whatever the debate for the increase in traffic.		
	JD stated traffic is a "global problem" in NSC area -		
	suggested multiple precincts get together to work on		
	resolving the issues which need bigger thinking rather		
	than individual precincts dealing with such issues in isolation.		
	Cr Keen pointed out that the upcoming Precinct Review		
	would be a good opportunity to look at how Precinct		
	Committees could best work together more effectively and collaboratively on issues such as traffic concerns.		
	JMQ - forthcoming changes to ferry timetable may result		

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		in less patronage of ferries and lead to an increase in residents using their vehicles.  Update on site meeting with Mayor and Member for Northshore on 3 December 2019 at the pedestrian crossing on Military Road near Cabramatta Road.  The meeting was advised that the pedestrian crossing time has been increased by 2 seconds. However, other suggestions were not taken on board. It was suggested the three precincts should report whether the change has made any difference to pedestrian safety. It was noted that any response should include solutions as well as pointing out the problems.  Harrison Precinct Committee will respond to the reply from the CPC.  Several Harrison Precinct residents indicated they hope to attend the Traffic Committee meeting on 7 February 2020.		
		Heritage Project - Joint initiative with Bennett Precinct Committee - this project is still on-going. JD from Bennett Precinct has recently joined the Harrison/Bennett Heritage subcommittee and attended Harrison meeting to show support and encourage collaboration.  The loss of older buildings on Military Road was raised and it was noted that MC has a good heritage retention program in place and the question was asked how NSC's approach could be benchmarked against this.
