We request clarification as to whether a bus can negotiate the proposed raised crossing which appears to be very close to the intersection	Council's Traffic & Transport Engineer has advised that the matter has been investigated. Firstly, during the crossing's design stage, the turning path for a 8.13m garbage truck was checked and confirmed for travel northbound on Willoughby Road then turning left at Clarke Street. Secondly, Council consulted Busways during the consultation stage in March 2022. Busways has raised no issues and concerns. Due to the construction of Metro station Crows Nest, temporary arrangement might be made between TfNSW and Busways, however, Council is not aware of the changes and the route might be temporary.
