Summary of Actions Arising (SOA) 2020 - Stanton Precinct

December	4	Australia Day - Precinct expressed its disappointment that normal Australia Day events for 2021 has been cancelled and request this be reconsidered by Council. This proposal was unanimously supported.	Council's Manager Communications & Events has advised that BBQ by the Bridge was cancelled this year because extensive Harbour Bridge maintenance works have closed off the area under the bridge where the event is held. Also, the Australia Day Council has cancelled the harbour events for this year which formed part of the event in Bradfield Park. Planning for large scale events takes several months and at the time Council would normally have started to book infrastructure and artists large events were prohibited by Public Health Order. In its place, we have increased the number of pop up activations in our village centres and will continue to provide low-key events for people to enjoy in the coming months. The organisers of the Celtic Dance event held in Civic Park on Australia Day are currently preparing a COVID-safety plan. This event may go ahead if it can meet the COVID-safe requirements set by NSW Health, but this decision will depend on how the current clusters progress.	Closed for Council
