#### **PURPOSE:**

This report has been prepared in response to the resolution of Council at the 28 March 2022 Council:

1.THAT Council organise for a 'Sustainable' festival at the Coal Loader as it is our sustainable achievement of North Sydney;

2.THAT the inclusion of a festival be considered as part of the current budget deliberations.

This report addresses this resolution by putting forward a concept plan for a North Sydney sustainability festival and includes details on festival components, delivery format, and anticipated budget.

## **EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:**

The inaugural Living Futures Festival will be held at the Coal Loader Centre for Sustainability over the period 24 - 30 April 2023. The festival will comprise of two components starting with the thought provoking 'Living Ideas' series and culminating in a full day activation on Sunday 30 April.

#### FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The expected budget for planning and delivery of the festival is approximately \$150,000. This amount will be funded from Council's Environment Levy Reserve due to the nexus between the expected outcomes of the Sustainability Festival and the policies and plans contained within the Environmental Levy.

## **RECOMMENDATION:**

- **1. THAT** Council approves the concept plan for the North Sydney Living Futures Festival to be held in April 2023 at the Coal Loader Centre for Sustainability;
- **2. THAT** all monies required to be expended throughout the course of planning and delivery of the Living Futures Festival is funded through Council's Environment Levy Reserve.

#### **BACKGROUND**

Many councils in NSW host a community sustainability festival to assist their residents in living an environmentally sustainable lifestyle. Most take the format of a one-day event that includes a mix of stage entertainment, stalls, workshops, and activities that appeal to a wide audience. Examples in the Sydney region include Randwick City Council's Eco Living Festival, the Ryde Sustainability Festival and the Northern Beaches Ocean Care Day. Other Councils deliver the event with a multi-day format such as Lake Macquarie's Living Smart Festival. The National Sustainable Living Festival held annually in Melbourne is a month-long event run by a community organisation that promotes third party sustainability events over the month of February to facilitate positive behaviour change on the local and national level.

North Sydney Council aims to launch its own sustainability festival in 2023 with a multi-day activation at the Coal Loader Centre for Sustainability. The 'Living Futures Festival' will bring to life Councils guiding principles of sustainability and inclusivity, as stated in the Community Strategic Plan, North Sydney's Vision 2040, and is designed to showcase sustainability best practices that will help us to achieve our community targets listed in the Environmental Sustainability Strategy 2030.

By planning the festival with dual components and incorporating the Living Ideas Series, North Sydney has differentiated itself from other sustainability festivals in the Sydney area.

#### **DETAIL**

# **Living Futures Festival**

The inaugural Living Futures Festival will be a hallmark event that will engage, educate, and entertain a large local and regional audience through a week-long activation at the Coal Loader. The Living Futures Festival will run from 24-30 April and will begin with a series of thought provoking 'Living Ideas' events and culminate in a full day activation.

# 1. Living Ideas Series

A series of think-tank events aimed at engaging our wider community in thought provoking discussions on trending environmental topics. With a broad target audience of young and old, professionals, students and anyone interested in sustainability, the Living Ideas series will ask the hard questions and spark debate via facilitated panel discussions, keynote speakers and audience Q&A sessions.

With well-known personalities, industry specialists, academics and social influencers as the speakers, the Living Ideas series aims to cover such themes as circular economy, fashion, food waste, the renewable energy future, art in the environment and more. Dependent on speaker costs and availability, it is anticipated the Living Ideas Series will encompass 3-5 facilitated panel discussions and keynote presentations.

Key discussion points, findings and ideas will be captured through 'visual note taking' and featured as an artwork display at the one-day festival.

## 2. Full day activation

The full day activation will be the hallmark event of the Living Futures Festival, held at the Coal Loader encompassing the entire site. It will include stage entertainment, stalls, workshops, demonstrations, talks, tours, free activities, food, kids' activities and more. The festival will engage a wide local and regional audience, including families, youth, seniors, residents and visitors to the area. A high-profile personality will be engaged to emcee the stage entertainment and will headline the event.

Aiming to engage around 10,000 participants from all over Sydney, people will have the opportunity engage as little or as much as they like. From passive education through infotainment to active education through hands on activity, the festival will encourage and facilitate sustainable behaviour change as well as be a fun day out at North Sydney's exceptionally unique venue, the Coal Loader Centre for Sustainability.

## Delivery

Considering current staffing and resourcing levels and committed operational plans for the Environmental Services team in FY 22/23 we propose the following delivery option as outlined in Table 1 below.

# **Budget**

Total costs for the festival will combine the costs associated with event production and event activation. It is anticipated the total cost of the Living Futures Festival will be approximately \$150,000 (Table 2).
