Based on the false premise that the resolutions were made, it is not necessary for Ausgrid to provide an urgent briefing, or to reverse any staffing decisions made for the North Sydney area."  Further, On 30 April 2025, The Hon Penny Sharpe MLC responded to Council's letter (Resolution 3). This response included advice that "the Critical Coverage of District operators for all of Sydney with respect to night shifts remains unchanged, and although these workers might have a depot base allocated to them, they travel all over Sydney as required when responding to unplanned events."
