Background

At its meeting on 8 December 2025, Council resolved:

1.THAT Council note that the North Sydney Traffic Committee will meet on 6 February 2026 and a further report will be submitted to that meeting to confirm the meeting dates for the rest of 2026.

The meetings of the North Sydney Traffic Committee (NSTC) after 6 February 2026 are proposed to be held every eighth Friday after that.

It is proposed to amend the meeting frequency to reflect changes in the endorsement processes due to an increased number of approvals being able to occur through delegated authority, without the requirement of being first considered by the Committee prior to achieving approvals.

Report

The parliamentary sitting dates for 2026 have been adopted and therefore the Traffic Committee meeting dates can now be scheduled.

All North Sydney Traffic Committee recommendations/minutes must be approved by Council. The recommendations/minutes are reported to the first available Council meeting after being finalised.
