EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

The 2018 Coal Loader Studio artist Rhonda Pryor was very productive throughout 2018 holding monthly open days and artist talks. Five free community art workshops were held during the residency period which were very popular with the community, catering for both children and adults. With a background in the visual arts and a focus on contemporary textiles, Rhonda facilitated a range of workshops including Slow Stitch Apron Workshop, Slow Stitch Tote Bag Workshop and 2 x Japanese Boro Rice Bag Workshops. Rhonda also participated in the annual Children's Festival program delivering workshops designed for children in October as well as participating in the Seniors Festival in February delivering a popular 'Slow Stich Apron Workshop'. Overall, the year was productive and a very positive experience for all involved. Details of the recommended 2019 Artist are also provided.

FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS:

The artist is not required to pay a rental fee but instead is required to be available to provide an "Open Studio" for the public one day per month and design and deliver four workshops to the community at no charge. This is in contrast to the Primrose Park Artist Studios which have bathroom, kitchenette and all-weather facilities and where a low cost rental is charged.

BACKGROUND

North Sydney Council established the Coal Loader Artist's Studio Program in 2011 with the aim to support local and regional artists in developing their art practice through the provision of a free Artist Studio space at the Coal Loader Centre for Sustainability in Waverton. The program is designed to encourage artists to share their creative insights with the community and raise awareness of cultural expression through sustainable means. The community engagement aspect requires that the artist will design and deliver two workshops to the community at no charge and offer a monthly public program of artist talks.
