PURPOSE:

This report is to provide Council with an analysis and recommendation of the tender process for Tender 35-2021 for Southern Lawn, St Leonards Park

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Tenders were called and were received until 3pm on 7 December 2021 for the submission of tenders to undertake Southern Lawn, St Leonards Park.

BACKGROUND

Council adopted the low intervention St Leonards Park Landscape Masterplan (SLP LMP) in February 2018 after extensive community and stakeholder consultation. Implementation of the works identified in the SLP LMP is being carried out over stages.

Since adoption of the masterplan a number of projects have been delivered including the award-winning Stage 1-Miller St Forecourt. Other discrete projects have included the upgrade to the practice cricket wicket adjacent to the Parks Depot, and the shared pedestrian and bicycle path along Ridge Street.

Most recently the substantial upgrade to Tunks Way and the relocation of the Field Gun was undertaken which delivered a widened and reconstructed central pathway, new lighting, seating and extensive planting works.

The Southern Lawn forms Stage 3 of the projects identified in the SLP LMP and includes the relocation of the pathway currently adjacent to the imposing North Sydney Oval wall. New seating areas, lighting and additional planting all form part of these works which are located between the Oval wall, Miller Street and Tunks Way.

TENDERS RECEIVED

The methodology adopted to undertake the tender evaluation of Tender 35-2021 was based on selection criteria outlined in the tender documents and in accordance with the Local Government Act 1993 and the Local Government (General) Regulation 2005.

Open tenders were called and were received until 3.00pm 7 December 2021 via Tenderlink. At close of tenders, four tenders were received. Listed in **strict alphabetical order**, the tenderers were:
