FUNDING FOR WARRINGAH NOISE WALL WORK

A \$150,000 funding allocation in the 2011-12 State Budget will provide for testing for potential noise walls along the Warringah Freeway, Member for Willoughby Gladys Berejiklian said.

"I am pleased to announce the NSW Government has provided a record \$8 million for the Noise Abatement Program across NSW, which includes \$150,000 for testing in relation to noise abatement walls in the Willoughby electorate," Ms Berejiklian said.

"Road traffic noise investigations have already been carried out between Willoughby Road and south of Falcon Street and as a result, three locations have been recommended for detailed investigations.

"Work will now be carried out in Sexton Place and West Street in Cammeray and Merlin Street in Neutral Bay to help develop a detailed design for noise walls.

"The investigations will make sure future noise walls are installed effectively along the Warringah Freeway.

"As well, additional investigations will be carried out along the Warringah Freeway to determine whether noise walls in other sites could also be considered for the future.

"Residents and North Sydney Council will be consulted during the investigations and the installation of the proposed noise walls.

"I welcome this news for our community," Ms Berejiklian said.
